The Daybreak Saga


Finding sparks of inspiration from interesting things surrounding them is inevitable for a young artist, but preserving and nurturing it as a form of love is another matter. Wayang kulit (Javanese shadow puppet) has deeply influenced Anjastama HP throughout his life journey. Furthermore, that influence has been carefully nurtured, culminating in this third solo exhibition. Pramoedya Ananta Toer was right, "And also there is no love that appears suddenly out of the blue, because love is a child of culture, not a stone dropped from heaven." Love for something is a process of learning, experiencing, and gaining a humanistic understanding of oneself and one's surroundings, not just sudden emotions or instincts. Anjastama's journey of realizing and nurturing this spark of ideas has grown from awareness and consistency.

Perhaps we might not expect and even agree that Anjastama's work originates from this inspiration, as it can be quite challenging to recognize to visually associate the objects with the forms of wayang in our heads. Anjastama does not deconstruct them in gradual steps, but through his art, he tries to break down the form of traditional objects or concepts into their basic elements, their characteristics, essence of their stories, then reconstructing them in an unconventional, but popular way and form. This is a way of breaking down and reconstructing established philosophies and visual structures. From this process, the possibility of narrating traditional stories can be more expansive. His work has the potential to invite us to reconsider the meaning, function, and how parts of traditional stories are a reflection of our lives today.



In The *Daybreak Saga*, Anjastama is inspired, understands, explores, and manifests parts of mythology/traditional story (saga) full of symbolism, particularly the heroism of the children of Bima (a figure from the Mahabarata epic), namely Antareja, Gatotkaca, and Antasena. The three characters that inspired him live side by side alongside various other figures including anthropomorphic ones in a complex, warm, and energetic modern-futuristic landscape. This artistic contribution consistently seeks to uncover important, yet often hidden stories. This presentation also shows that visual art can bridge today's generation with the cultural heritage of Nusantara, casting it in the morning light.

Anjastama HP

Anjastama HP (b. 1996) is an artist from Indonesia, born in Sukoharjo, Central Java, on January 29, 1996. He completed his Bachelor of Fine Arts degree at the Indonesian Institute of the Arts, Yogyakarta.

Anjastama was born and raised in accordance with Javanese traditions, which made him more interested in his culture, but he faces the challenge of translating this culture into something beautiful, unique, and acceptable to people who are not from Java. In his work, he transforms traditional Javanese puppets into human forms and combines his personal feelings into his work. In this way, Anjastama creates his own world. The subjects he paints are inspired by the three children of Bima and are so called wayang characters.
