

Odyssey: Hearth and Mire

Srisasanti Gallery is pleased to present Odyssey: Hearth & Mire, Liffi Wongso's first solo exhibition with the gallery.

A place where fire is kept inside a home, the hearth, suggests a familiar feeling of being inside or indoors, surrounded by warmth. Mire, on the other hand, brings to mind the bodily sensation of soil or mud. Its heaviness, its cling, its dampness, and the feeling of being outside. The exhibition title is held together by the idea of an odyssey, pointing out Liffi's introspective journey through an internal terrain, seeking wonder in the unnoticed ordinary that lingers between comfort and unease.

In her latest body of work, Liffi reflects the feeling of being a child once described as "mediocre." Instead of dwelling on the ordinary, she begins to ask whether ordinariness might carry its own form of greatness. She developed a habit of noticing small things around her, imagining presences inside everyday things. Drawing and painting became her way of bringing that imagination to life, to reveal that simplicity itself holds wonder.


Drawing inspiration from ancient Western fairy tales and folklore, Liffi's works depict hybrid flora, almost like botanical illustrations placed in overlapping layers. Flowers, leaves, and fungi grow freely, while vines and branches twist and turn. Within the abundance, slender girls with elongated limbs inhabit and blend with the compositions. Their hair extends and flows as long strands that seem to merge with roots and petals around them. Their bodies do not dominate the setting. Rather, they are woven into it. They seem to grow from and blend in with their surroundings, instead of merely standing out as the main characters

Liffi is particularly interested in the myth of elves in Icelandic and Faroese folklore, known as Huldufólk or the hidden people. They are supernatural beings that resemble humans in appearance and behavior, yet they inhabit a parallel world. Similarly, Liffi's drawings are non-linear; they drift through the same in-between spaces. They don't contain particularly great tales

or tragedies; rather, they imply what happens in between or around them. Her figures are beings that exist but are ignored, beyond our perception. Each work can be treated as an unseen story; they are overlooked, but they captivate us.

Liffi is known for her use of watercolor on paper, a medium she has used for well over eight years. Initially chosen by her for its softness and transparency, each layer emerges gradually, often influenced by pauses in her process. During the course of preparing for this exhibition, her relationship with the material took an unexpected turn. A studio mishap, where a brush cup sits too close to a drinking glass, led her to wonder what it would mean if the pigments she used posed no harm at all. It became a year-long experiment in making her own paints from honey, dried petals, and plant gum. Through these trials, she ended up with a palette that was safe to taste. What is interesting is the idea that the materials touching her hands and mouth could feel connected to the same world as the plants, soil, and creatures in her scenes. In this sense, Liffi's pigments behave less like tools—they belong in the world she creates, like minuscule, living organisms.

Although the works appear full and visually assertive, their source is far more modest. The density grows from the way Liffi pays attention to things that would normally slip past notice. What appears grand and magical at first comes from observations that slowly build up over time. Through Odyssey: Hearth & Mire, Liffi lifts small, often unnoticed things into view, granting a presence to those that rarely receive.
